At the evening concerts the audience will enjoy three excellent works by Alfred Schnittke, Dmitri Shostakovich and Joseph Haydn. *Moz-Art à la Haydn* (1977), is emblematic of Schnittke's extraordinary ability to resort to wit and irony as reaction to the daunting feelings of alienation and loss. It contains references to the two iconic Classical masters, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Joseph Haydn, hence its title, and he achieves this by using fragments from works by Mozart and Haydn. Thus, the composer gives his own refreshing perspective on the classical style and at the same time breaks established rituals such as light and stage arrangement.

Shostakovich's 1st cello concerto (1959), created for the legendary Russian cellist Mstislav Rostropovich, is a frenetically dynamic, emotionally intense and wickedly virtuosic work. It begins with the 1st movement being a 'jocular march', rendering its humour almost grotesque, by the frenetic character and emotional intensity. The concerto progresses to its conclusion with sheer force.

One of Haydn's most successful and frequently played "London" Symphonies, the no. 100, stands out for its sublimely elegant themes, grandeur and its second movement's musical representation of a war battle. It contains an unusual usage of band percussion instruments and a striking trumpet fanfare to allude to a war battle, hence its nickname, the 'Military' symphony.
