A) Submissions:

1. All articles which fall within the scope of the journal will be considered on condition they are original and have not been submitted elsewhere. Otherwise publication will not be allowed.

2. The deadline for submissions is December 1st, 2025. Manuscripts should be submitted electonically, in Word format, at: epetiridakee@moec.gov.cy (Dr Irene

Paraskeva Rodosthenous, Debuty Director - Cyprus Research Centre-Dr Anastasia Yiangou, Dr Constantinos Georgiou).

Along with the manuscript authors should also submit:

a) Their title and affiliation

b) Abstract (up to 200 words)

c) 3-4 key words

3. Submissions should not exceed 12.000 words (including notes and footnotes).

4. EPETIRIDA accepts submissions in Greek, English, French, German and Italian.

5. Authors are responsible for the linguistic editing of their texts, regardless of the language in which they are submitted. Papers submitted in Greek should follow the standard rules of Modern Greek writing.

6. The Cyprus Research Centre retains the right of rejecting articles which require serious and extensive revising.

7. After the deadline for submission of papers (December 1, 2025), the editors of the volume will inform the authors whether their papers fulfill the specifications for publication. Where necessary the editors will make suggestions for modification as well as comments on the text to which the authors will have to respond. Once texts are re-submitted to the editors, no changes or additions are permitted (<u>especially</u> <u>once the pagination stage is completed</u>), except of cases of typographical errors, which do not affect the volume's page numbering.

8. The views expressed by the authors in theis papers do not necessarily reflect the view of the C.R.C.

9. *Epetirida* permits the republishing of any article provided that the source is mentioned.

10. Authors must prepare their work according to the specifications given below in order to ensure the quality of the volume.

B) Author Guidelines:

1. <u>Fonts and spacing:</u> Times New Roman, 12 pt., 1,5 line spacing. For notes and references use Times New Roman, 10 pt., single spacing.

2. <u>Paragraph alignment</u>: Justified (excluding title).

3. <u>Title</u>: Title should be given in bold, size 16 pt, centered, lowercase letters.

4. <u>Quotations/Extracts</u>: Extracts must be the exact reproduction of the original in both spelling and punctuation and noted within single quotation marks. Quotations/extracts of less than 50 words can be worked into the main body of the text and should be clearly defined with opening and closing quotation marks.

Quotations/extracts of 50 words or more should be set as a separate, indented paragraph (1cm on the right, 1cm on the left), with no quotation marks and font size 11. Omission of text within a quotation is stated as follows: [...]. Quotations that are written in a polytonic system in the original should be transcribed accurately into polytonic under the responsibility of the author.

5. <u>Abbreviations and acronyms</u>: Please use the following abbreviations in the main body of the text as well as in footnotes: vol.:volume, trans.:translation, ed.: editor, eds: editors, c.:circa. Please do not use punctuation in acronyms (EOKA rather than E.O.K.A.).

6. <u>Numbering</u>: Numbers up until nine should be written in full. Please use numerals for number 10 and above (11, 12, 13...). Centuries: 1st century, 20th century), years (9 A.D., 1670 A.D.) and numberings (1., 2., 3., or 5-7, 9-11) are written in arabic numerals. For numbers above 1.000 (when it does not concern a year, for example 1453) please use full stop (for example 1.156, 12.564).

7. The use in the texts of words deriving from another language should be written in italics (for example *status quo*).

8. <u>Capital letters</u>: First World War, Second World War, George I, Archbishop Makarios III, etc. Also: Governor Ronald Storrs but governor of Cyprus, Archbishop Cyril III but the archbishop of Cyprus, the Minister of Education Constantinos Spyridakis but the minister of education of Cyprus etc.

9. Footnotes should be used when referencing to primary sources and bibliography. The number of the footnote should follow the punctuation mark and should appear in continuous order beginning from 1. Sources should be noted in the language they are written.

Footnotes:

For books or edited volumes, in their original language, the following order must be noted: Author, *title*, place of publication, publisher's name, year, page/pages. The first time a work is cited its full details should be noted. Subsequent references to that work should only include the author's surname, brief title and page number (please note that space is needed after characters: p. 1, pp. 22-23. Also, vol. 1, vol. 2). Please do not use *ibid* when referring more than once to the same source.

Series titles should be noted as follows (not in italics) right after the book's title.

Example:

Θ. Παπαδόπουλλος, Προξενικά έγγραφα του ΙΘ΄ αιώνος, Λευκωσία: Κέντρο Επιστημονικών Ερευνών, Πηγαί και Μελέται της Κυπριακής Ιστορίας, VIII, 1980. The number of the edition of a book should be declared right after the publication year.

For example: Αγνή Μιχαηλίδη, Λάρνακα: η παλιά Σκάλα, Λευκωσία: 1983², pp. 21-22.

C. Figures and illustrative material

Illustrations, tables and graphs submitted with the article should:

1. Be submitted in a folder with the author's name in high resolution in JPG/jpeg form. The folder should be submitted to the Epetirida email (<u>epetiridakee@moec.gov.cy</u>) via WeTransfer.

2. Should be numbered and each one should be accompanied by its caption. Captions should include a brief description and source (for example: Image 1: Cyprus Technical Institute (source: Press and Information Office).

3. Authors are responsible for securing permission to use the illustrative material. Illustrative material will be included in the volume unless the permission for their use is submitted.

4. Illustrations should not be more than ten.
